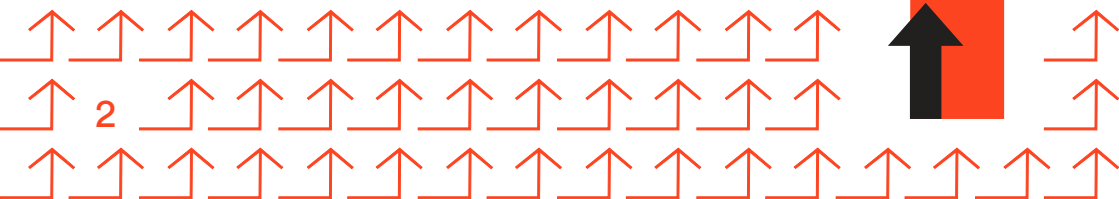
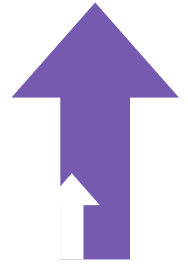


WHAT ARE T LEVELS?

T Levels are key to the Government's ambitious programme to provide the technical expertise for the jobs of the future. They are exciting new courses devised specifically with employers to ensure students learn relevant and up-to-date practices from the industry sector that interests them most.

Equivalent to three A Levels, they are technical based qualifications that prepare students for work or higher education. They include a substantial industry placement of 315 hours, which equates to nine weeks or 45 days over the two years, ensuring students benefit from a solid introduction to the workplace.

T Levels can be studied by anyone aged 16–19** and up to the age of 24 for students who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

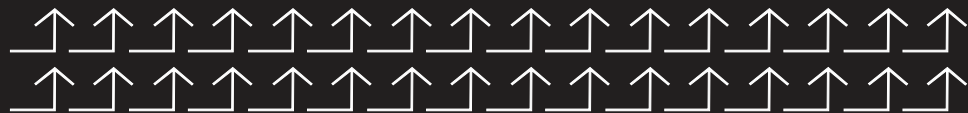

HOW ARE T LEVELS DIFFERENT TO OTHER LEVEL 3 QUALIFICATIONS?



T Level	80% classroom	20% industry placement
Apprenticeship	20% classroom	80% employment
A Level	100% classroom	

WILL T LEVELS ALLOW ME TO STUDY AT UNIVERSITY?

Absolutely!

Following on from your GCSEs, **T Levels are equivalent to 3 A Levels** and the highest grade you can achieve is a Distinction* which is worth 168 UCAS points (equal to 3A* at A Level).

HOW MANY UCAS TARIFF POINTS DOES A T LEVEL HAVE?

- ↗ 168 Distinction
- ↗ 144 Distinction
- ↗ 120 Merit
- ↗ 96 Pass (C or above on the core)
- ↗ 72 Pass (D or E on the core)

WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR A T LEVEL?

5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above to include English and Maths. If you don't meet the entry requirements for a T Level then you can study a T Level Foundation Year





Our T Level Foundation Year Programme is a one-year course designed to develop the skills, knowledge and behaviours to support progression onto, and success on, a T Level.

In addition to enabling students to develop their English and Maths, if needed, our T Level Foundation Year provides a route into T Levels for students who may need further support to address barriers such as prior attainment, pastoral issues or personal development needs.



I chose to study Health because I am interested in becoming an adult nurse and this qualification will lead me into a nursing degree. The T level qualification is equivalent to three A levels which will allow me to start my degree course directly after leaving college. Also, this course provides me with work experience that will prepare me not only for my university course, but also to work within the healthcare industry. At College, I feel supported as I am surrounded by kind staff such as the pastoral team and my lecturers who can help with any issues or concerns.

My industry placement is in a care home near where I live called St Lukes care home which specialises in dementia care. I am excited to start my industry placement because I will finally be able to put all the things that I have been learning into practice. Once I finish my T level course in health, I would like to do a university course at the Berkshire Institute of Health and get a degree in adult nursing which will allow me to become a registered nurse. Then I would like to start practicing in acute care as my end goal is to be a trauma nurse. However I understand that along the way my aspirations may change, yet the T Level is the first step to many different career opportunities.
